Occasionally, texts include words with vowels that are beyond what the children have learned. We present these vowels in gray text to communicate that the children may need support to decode these words.



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
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
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






























Read names with a sh'va nach.

▶ The sh'vas here are all resting because they are in middle of a word and they don't follow a 'big' nikudah. Patach and segol are 'small' nikudot.







MIDDLE SH'VA - NOUNS

A sh'va in the middle of word usually rests, unless it follows one of the five pronounced sh'va rules. This means that the sh'va becomes part of the previous syllable.


